president's report



JOHN HOBAN, PRESIDENT

The year in Review

The year 2025 saw a general rise in the cost of living. Business costs also rose. Despite these twin pressures, the club turned a profit of over \$200k.

It is a good result considering the business environment and the considerable expense of the recent renovations.

Future Plans

The Board has developed a conceptual plan aimed at increasing the Club's long-term revenue. The plan will include introducing new food and beverage offerings and exploring opportunities for commercial facilities that the Club may lease out. We aim to lodge the Development Application (DA) with the Council by July this year.

Improved Services to our members

Members are enjoying the popular \$20 for \$20 promotion, simply spend \$20 in the Club within a calendar month and receive \$20 worth of food and beverage points the following month as a reward.

New lighting fixtures have been installed in the Club's main bar and bistro lounge areas, as part of our commitment to continuously improving the Club's facilities. Our dedicated team has been trained to deliver exceptional service, ensuring every patron enjoys a warm, welcoming experience at the Club.

Club Grants

In 2025, the club provided a total of \$165,015 in grants. Our sub clubs received \$71,887 which is directed to the local Penshurst community. Patrons are encouraged to join one of the many Penshurst RSL Sub-Clubs, including Rugby League, Golf, Youth Swim Club, as well as the RSL Sub-Branch, Travel Club, and Palace Patch Workers.

Community

Penshurst RSL Club is the biggest employer in Penshurst. Apart from providing grants to the community and our sub clubs, we also provide a meeting place for many local community groups. Last year we provided a prize to the Penshurst Public School for academic achievement. We intend to further extend our reach into the local Penshurst community to give a helping hand.

Award of Life membership

I would like to extend my warm congratulations to Kim Thompson on being awarded Life Membership at the club's recent Annual General Meeting. This honour recognises Kim's outstanding commitment, positive impact, and continued support of the Club and our community.

ceo's report

Hello Members,

Firstly, I would like to wish all our members good health and happiness for 2026. It is my pleasure to present my report for the financial year ending 31 December 2025.

Although the club industry faced a number of challenges during the year, your Club remained strong and continued to move forward. Careful financial management and a clear focus on our long-term plans have allowed us to keep improving the Club while maintaining the friendly and welcoming atmosphere our members enjoy.

Planning for the Future

During the year the Board looked closely at the Club's long-term future. A feasibility study and master planning proposal were prepared and presented to the Board.

The Board and senior management also held a strategic planning workshop to review and update the Club's plans for the future. This work will help guide the Club as we continue to improve and grow for the benefit of both current and future members.

Improvements Around the Club

Throughout the year a number of improvements were made around the Club to make it more comfortable and enjoyable for our members.

These included:

- New automatic doors at the front entrance
- New digital menu screens in the bistro
- Updated signage throughout the Club
- New lighting in the main lounge and bistro areas
- Refurbished honour boards
- Repainting of the basement area
- Installation of Verasol blinds and privacy screens in the outdoor gaming area
- New plants and landscaping inside and outside the Club

Members also enjoyed several popular promotions, including Triple Points in August and Dash for Cash in December.

I am also pleased to report that membership remained strong, with total membership reaching 6,273 members at the end of 2025.

Financial Performance

The Club recorded another profitable year and remains in a strong financial position.

Total Members' Funds increased during the year, showing the continued strength of the Club. The Board also approved a \$1 million term deposit investment to provide additional income for the Club.

In October 2025 the Club fully repaid its hire purchase facility, which further strengthened the Club's financial position.

The Club updated its' commercial tenancy, with the previous chemist lease changing to a child psychologist, which will continue to provide a steady rental income.

Governance and Compliance

During the year the Board and management continued to focus on good governance and making sure the Club meets all NSW legal requirements.

This included strengthening responsible gambling practices and improving staff training and awareness around Anti-Money Laundering and Counter-Terrorism Financing laws.

While these rules can sometimes be complex, they are important to ensure the Club operates responsibly and remains strong into the future.

Changes to NSW legislation relating to club operating hours also required some adjustments to certain services within the Club. These changes were made to ensure the Club remains fully compliant with the law.

I would like to sincerely thank our President, John Hoban, and the Board of Directors for their leadership and support throughout the year.

Thank you also to Kevin Kelly, who resigned as a Director during the year. We welcome Sean Willett to the Board and congratulate Kim Thompson on being awarded Life Membership in recognition of his contribution to the Club.

My thanks also go to our Operations Manager, Matthew Hill, and the entire management team for their dedication and hard work. I would also like to thank all of our staff who work every day to ensure the Club runs smoothly and that our members and guests feel welcome.

A special thank you goes to our caterer Andy and his team, who continue to provide excellent food and service.

We also congratulate several staff members who celebrated important service milestones this year:

- Corrine – 10 years of service
- Phill – 25 years of service
- Mick – 35 years of service

Finally, I would like to thank all of our members for your ongoing loyalty and support. The Club continues to do well because of you.

 5. Declare the results of the election of Directors.
 6. General Business: To transact any business of which due notice has been given.

FIRST ORDINARY RESOLUTION

That pursuant to Section 10(6A)(b) of the Registered Clubs' Act 1976, the members hereby approve and agree to the Board and the other persons referred to below, during the period preceding the 2027 Annual General Meeting, receiving the following benefits outlined in sub-paragraphs (i) to (iv) and the members further acknowledge that the benefits are not available to members generally but only to those members of the Club specified in this Ordinary Resolution:

- (i) the reasonable cost of a meal and beverage for each Director immediately after a Board or Committee Meeting on the day of that meeting.
- (ii) the reasonable cost of a meal and beverage for each Director, whenever each Director is performing a duty at the Club.

- (iii) the reasonable expenses incurred by Directors in relation to such other duties including entertainment of special guests to the Club and other promotional activities performed by Directors, such activities and expense being approved by the Board before payment is made, on the production of receipts, invoices, or other proper documentary evidence of such expenditure.
- (iv) the reasonable cost of a Board Christmas Lunch attended by the Directors and their partners and senior management and their partners.
- (v) the reasonable cost of providing each Director a half ham prior to Christmas.
- (vi) the cost of providing each Director with up to fifty (50) drink vouchers per annum to be redeemed at their discretion.
- (vii) the provision of two (2) reserved car spaces as follows:
 - a. one (1) for a Director;
 - b. one (1) for the Sub Branch Secretary.
- (viii) the cost associated with management issuing drink vouchers to those members who carry out volunteer work within the Club.
- (ix) the reasonable expense in the provision of free refreshments to members who have attended the Annual General Meeting at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting for a period not exceeding two (2) hours as determined by the Chairman or his nominated representative.
- (x) the reasonable cost of Club apparel being provided to directors as required.
- xi. the reasonable cost of an electronic device (for example laptop or iPad).

SECOND ORDINARY RESOLUTION

That pursuant to Section 10(6A)(b) of the Registered Clubs' Act 1976, the members hereby approve and agree to the expenditure by the Club of a sum not exceeding \$20,000 during the period preceding the 2027 Annual General Meeting, for the professional development and education of Directors as follows:

- (xii) the reasonable cost of a delegation of Directors attending the Clubs NSW Annual General Meeting.
- (xiii) the reasonable cost of Directors attending seminars, lectures, trade displays and other similar events as may be determined by the Board from time to time.
- (xiv) the reasonable cost of Directors attending other registered clubs for the purpose of viewing and assessing their facilities and method of operation providing such attendances are approved by the Board as being necessary for the betterment of the Club.

The members acknowledge that the benefits conferred in this Second Ordinary Resolution are not available to members generally but only to those members of the Club specified in this Second Ordinary Resolution.

THIRD ORDINARY RESOLUTION

That pursuant to Section 10(6) (b) of the Registered Clubs' Act 1976, the members hereby approve and agree to the confer the following sums of honoraria on the Directors specified in respect of their services as a member of the Board:

- President – sum of \$1,875 per quarter
- Vice-President – sum of \$1,625 per quarter
- Each Ordinary Director – sum of \$1,375 per quarter

The members acknowledge that the benefits conferred in this Third Ordinary Resolution are not available to members generally but only to those members of the Club specified in this Third Ordinary Resolution.

Explanatory Message to Members regarding the Ordinary Resolutions

Section 10(1) (i) and (j) of the Registered Clubs Act 1976 prohibits the Club from offering a benefit or advantage to any member unless it is offered equally to all members of the Club.

Section 10(6) provides an exception to section 10(1) (i) and (j) where the benefit comprises an honorarium conferred on Directors of the Club.

Section 10(6A) (b) of the Registered Clubs Act 1976 allows a member to receive a benefit if the benefit conferred is not in the form of money (ie is in the form of meals, drinks, car parking spaces etc) and those benefits are approved by an ordinary resolution of the members of the Club in general meeting prior to the benefit being provided.

The First Ordinary Resolution is to have the members in general meeting approve, in accordance with section 10(6A) (b) of the Registered Clubs Act 1976, reasonable expenditure by the Club in relation to the conferral of non-monetary benefits on Directors and specific members as specified in the resolution.

The Second Ordinary Resolution is to have the members

in general meeting approve, in accordance with section 10(6A) (b) of the Registered Clubs Act 1976 non-monetary benefits including the reasonable expenditure by the Club for the Directors to attend seminars, lectures, trade displays, and other similar events, including the registered club industry's peak industry association (Clubs NSW) Annual General Meeting, and to visit other clubs, to enable the Club's Board to keep abreast of current trends and developments which have a significant bearing on the nature and the way in which the Club conducts its business.

The Third Ordinary Resolution is to have the members in general meeting approve, in accordance with section 10(6) (b) of the Registered Clubs Act 1976, the conferral of an amount of money (ie honorarium) on the President, Vice President and Directors of the Board in recognition of their services as members of the Board.

GENERAL NOTES TO MEMBERS

1. All Life Members, and financial RSL Members and Associate Members (except employees of the Club) are entitled to vote on the Ordinary Resolutions.
2. To be passed, each Ordinary Resolution must receive votes in its favour from not less than a majority (50%+1) of those members who being eligible to do so, vote in person at the meeting.
3. As a result of the provisions of the Corporations Act 2001, the Ordinary Resolutions must be considered as a whole and cannot be altered by motions from the floor of the meeting.
4. Members should read the Explanatory Message to Members following the Ordinary Resolutions which explains the nature and effect of each Ordinary Resolution.
5. Please direct any question or concerns about the Ordinary Resolutions to the Chief Executive Officer of the Club, if possible before the meeting.
6. Members of the Club, who are employees of the Club, cannot vote on the Ordinary Resolutions.
7. Members are asked to respectfully submit any questions they may have regarding the Financial Report, Directors Report and the Auditor's Report, in writing at least seven (7) days in advance of the meeting to the Chief Executive Officer, so informed responses can be provided at the meeting.
8. Proxy Votes are not allowed under the Registered Clubs Act 1972.

Sub Branch Club Report

2025 was a year of commemoration, friendship and camaraderie.

The sub-Branch hosted and attended many services paying tribute to members of services, past and present. As well, there were a number of changes to the membership of the Executive and Management Committee. I take this opportunity to thank Keith Pratt, Tom Lyons and Sean McManus who resigned as president, vice-president and curator respectively.

On 13 April we held our Anzac Sunday march and service. Many thanks to everyone who attended. Special thanks to our guest speaker, Gary Mawson, President Southern Metropolitan District Council; the Riverwood Hornets who led the march; the Catafalque Party; the Salvation Army band, vocalist and bugler; and St John's Ambulance volunteers. Wreaths were laid by representatives of a number of organisations including local RSLs, Legacy, War Widows, local schools and Penshurst RSL junior sporting clubs.

On July 27, 1953 an armistice was signed, bringing an end to the active fighting in the Korean War. The sub-Branch commemorated the 75th anniversary - we remembered the more than 18,000 Australian personnel who served in Korea, including the 400 who paid the ultimate sacrifice, the 1,200 wounded and the 30 taken prisoner and those missing in action.

The Bridge Street Memorial was the venue for a short informal Remembrance Day service on 11 November. Following the President's address there was a minute's silence to remember all those who have died or suffered in wars and other military operations. Wreaths were then laid by official guests and representatives from local schools. Special thanks to the two students from Penshurst West Public School who recited 'In Flanders Field'.

Sub-Branch representatives also attended a number of other commemorative ceremonies, including the ANZAC Day Dawn Service at Oatley Memorial Gardens; Vietnam Veterans Day at Bankstown Sports Club; Remembrance Day at the Kokoda Walkway; Afghanistan, Iraq & Middle-East (MEOA) Commemoration Service at Engadine RSL sub-Branch; 'The Price of Freedom Remembrance Service' at War Grave Cemetery, Rookwood; and a number of services around Australia commemorating the 80th anniversary of Victory in the Pacific Day Victory (VP) Day.

An important development in 2026 was the work undertaken by our School Liaison officer, Ms Jennifer Thompson. The position had been dormant for a long time. Jennifer has already attended and spoken at several local school ANZAC Day assemblies and is available to visit other schools.

Bruce Alexander has assumed the role of curator/memorabilia officer. He has already introduced new exhibits to memorabilia cabinets. The next major task is the placement of paintings and other hangings along the walls next to the memorabilia cabinets.

The Travel Club has been running at Penshurst RSL Club since 2002, so we're now in our 24th year!

2025 was another full year with nine day trips, six theatre parties and two extended tours of six days each. The first one was in May to Queensland and its Capricorn Coast and flying via Brisbane. We stayed in Yeppoon and a coach drove us to the local sights each day. The second was a coach trip in October to the Murray and Victoria's High Country (see pic), staying five nights in Yarrawonga, and visiting well-known towns such as Beechworth, Bright, Echuca, Myrtleford and Glenrowan. Both were amazing trips and we were blessed with wonderful weather.

Youth Swim Club Report

We are now halfway through our 2025–2026 season and, after navigating a number of early challenges, the club is firmly back on track for another successful year.

At the conclusion of the 2024–2025 season, our team of 14 swimmers proudly represented Penshurst RSL Youth Swim Club at the NSW RSL Youth State Championships in Penrith. Every swimmer returned with new personal bests — a fantastic achievement and a testament to their dedication and hard work. We wrapped up the season at the end of March with a lively pool party, celebrating our swimmers' successes and another memorable year together.

One particularly special highlight occurred just one week before presentation night, when a group of volunteers, teachers and senior swimmers travelled to Canberra. They had the honour of visiting the Australian War Memorial, laying a wreath, and participating in the Last Post Ceremony. It was a deeply moving experience, and everyone involved felt privileged to represent the club while paying tribute to those who served and sacrificed.

The start of the new season was marked by some uncertainty. For the first time in decades, we were unable to return to our home pool in August due to access issues. Fortunately, Peakhurst West Swim Pool officially reopened on 1 November, with our club proudly becoming its very first user at 7.00am. The pool has benefited from a \$1.5 million state government investment, including a new roof and pump, and is now overseen by a diligent pool manager.

To ensure continuity for our swimmers, we proactively commenced squad and teacher training from August by hiring lanes at Roselands Aquatic Centre. We also renewed our teachers' CPR qualifications at Penshurst RSL Club. It was wonderful to welcome both familiar and new faces back to our learn-to-swim classes when they resumed on 1 November.

The competition season has also been progressing well. Our swimmers continued to achieve personal bests across four zone carnivals and the Zone

Championships. We now have nine families preparing to attend the State Championships in March at Muswellbrook, and we wish them every success — and plenty of fun — on the day.

At present, our Saturday pool hire lease remains uncertain while the NSW Department of Education continues the tender process to appoint a permanent pool operator. We are concerned that commercialisation may limit access for long-standing community users or result in significant increases in lesson fees. Since the 1960s, this pool has thrived as a community-built and community-driven facility, supported by volunteer effort and passion. We strongly believe this model remains the most sustainable and inclusive way forward.

Penshurst RSL Youth Swim Club is a proud, family-oriented, volunteer-run organisation dedicated to developing swimming ability and water safety skills for children and young people aged 4 to 25. Sponsored by Penshurst RSL Club, we offer a supportive and nurturing environment where swimmers can build confidence, skills and friendships. Lessons are open to children of financial members of the RSL Club.

This season's fees have been heavily discounted in light of the uncertainty around pool access. The fee includes \$20 for insurance and covers a one-hour Saturday morning session each week. Classes are grouped by ability, allowing swimmers to develop water confidence, safety awareness and technique in a friendly and welcoming setting.

We sincerely thank everyone — swimmers, families, volunteers, teachers and sponsors — who continue to support Penshurst RSL Youth Swim Club. Your commitment is what makes our club such a vibrant community, and we look forward to celebrating many more achievements in the months ahead.



The Palace Patchworkers

The Palace Patchworkers have had an outstanding year this year with making and distributing our Charity Quilts.

We had a lovely visitor earlier in the year, being one of the new Mum's from St George Special Care Nursery who received one of our baby quilts for her daughter in care. It was lovely to receive personal feedback to know how these quilts are able to lift the spirits when needed.

One of our members, Deni, also does special quilts for "Aussie Heroes". This group make quilts for serving members of the ADF who are able to make

some suggestions of what they would like on their quilt and the quilter tries to include their requests when making the quilt for them.

The members have managed to make over 400 quilts in the past 12 months and have sent them to the St George Neo Natal Intensive care unit, The Sydney Children's Hospital Pain and Palliative Care Unit , and St George ICU for their "End of Life "program , also the Organ Donors Program at St George
